We had also held the first APAGE International Symposium on Laparoscopic Oncology

and Hands-on Animal Workshop in Shanghai in April 2006. This was the first APAGE organized practical orientated meeting with hands-on live animal training. We are planning to have the second training workshop in May 2007.

Another goal of APAGE is to set up our own journal which is now named the "Asia Pacific Journal of Minimally Invasive Gynecology". This will be an electronic journal with open access via internet. It is an international scientific peer-reviewed journal on all aspects of clinical and experimental research, information and communication in the field of gynecologic endoscopy and minimally invasive therapy. All articles are published in English which is the official language of the journal. However, concurrent publication of the articles in other languages is encouraged to cater for members and readers whose native language is not English. I am honoured to be elected as the Editor-in-Chief of the journal and Prof. Osamu Tsutsumi and Prof. Chyi-Long Lee are the Associate Editors. We are now in the process of setting up the webpages for the journal which will be hosted by the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology of the Chinese University of Hong Kong. I would like to express my gratitude to Prof. Daljit Sahota for his technical support. You are all encouraged to submit your research work and articles to the Asia Pacific Journal of Minimally Invasive Gynecology.

The APAGE is now global. With all your support and participation, I believe APAGE will play a leading role in minimally invasive therapy in gynecology worldwide.

TAMIG Training Course Anecdote

Dr. Chin-Jung Wang, TAMIG General Secretary

Due to endoscopic surgery is more popular than before in Taiwan, most gynecologists are not unfamiliar with it. Since this year, workshops of the TAMIG provide more condensed classes for participants. The idea of new curriculum is to introduce all main points and important guidelines of endoscopic surgery at one time by surgery practice and speeches.

With sponsorship from OB/ GYN department of Taipei Veterans General Hospital, Johnson & Johnson Medical Taiwan, and Beamed Instrument Co., Ltd., Taiwan Association for Minimally Invasive Gynecology (TAMIG) held a successful surgery workshop for non-TAMIC members in Shu-Tian Urology Research Center of National Yang- Ming University on June 24th, 2006.

The morning class of the June 24th workshop was a hands-on animal surgery practice which followed real procedures of a laparoscopic surgery. Under supervision of well-experienced doctors, trainees anesthetized sows and performed salpingectomy, enucleation of ovarian tumor, and some more complicated surgeries, such as bowel repair > bladder repair, with real laparoscopy. The workshop stressed that every trainee should have enough chances to operate laparoscopies during practice, so there were not too many trainees in each group. With excellent teachers and hands-on practice, TAMIG believed that trainees of this workshop would quickly learn the keystones of performing a successful laparoscopic surgery and felt worthwhile to join this workshop.

In the afternoon class, TAMIG invited several distinguished experts as speakers to talk to basic knowledge of endoscopy and how to apply it to real operation. Prof. Chyi-Long Lee introduced energy used in endoscopy surgery, especially the principles of electrosurgery, which is the most popular energy in endoscopy surgery, to the trainees. The next speaker, Dr. Ming-Chang Chen, discribed basic techniques related to how to safely put laparoscopy and endoscopy instruments into human bodies and how CO2









pneumoperitoneum influences the function of human body. From President Chen's speech, trainees would learn that there are profound theories behind surgery procedures of which surgeons have usually got used. The last speaker of the first session was Dr. Chin-Jung Wang who is the General Secretary of TAMIG. He made a detailed introduction in how to use hysteroscopy as a diagnostic tool and how to perform difficult hysteroscopy surgery and endoscopic surgery. After fifteen minutes break, the program moved to the session two.

The first speaker of the second session was Dr. Gong-Liang Wang, who is not only a distinguished expert in laparoscopic surgery, but also a well-experienced doctor in gynecologic oncology field. Dr. Wang shared his experience in treating ovary tumor by laparoscopy and the management of malignant tumors which are found during operations in his speech. Dr. Wang stressed that if surgeons could correctly diagnose malignant tumors during surgeries, prevent tumor tissues contaminate other good tissues and organs in the patient's abdominal cavity, and carefully manage the cut, the chance of recurrence of cancer could be reduced and the survival rate of patients could be promoted. The next presentation which discussed several kinds of complications in endoscopic surgeriy was talked by Prof. Yung-Kuei Soong. The purpose of this speech was to help the trainees to have full understanding of complications which would happen during endoscopic surgery. Furthermore, keeping away from complications caused by endoscopic surgery would minimize opportunities to be sued by patients. Then, Dr. Yu-Shan Lin gave the trainees a lesson in hysterectomy. In his speech, Dr. Lin talked many practical skills of hysterectomy, such as how to diminish blood loss during operation and

remove the uterine from the patient. The last lecturer, Dr.Peng-Hui Wang, introduced laparoscopic surgery for gynecological oncology. TAMIG hopes that this educational activity would enhance and update gynecologists' knowledge in endoscopy.

Endoscopy surgery has almost become a necessary service for every hospital in Taiwan now, so most trainees have experiences in doing endoscopic surgery before this workshop. The objective of TAMIG and its workshops is to enhance gynecologists' ability to apply gynecologic endoscopy and minimally invasive therapy in practice. Moreover, TAMIG believes our workshops should lead trainees to the real world of advanced endoscopic surgery.

Welcome

Hence, APAGE decided to organize these symposia with hands-on workshop annually.
