Prashant Mangeshikar, Prof. Whye Lee, Prof. Yasuvoshi Hayashi (Bao-Liang Lin), Prof. C.Y. Liu, Prof. Felix Wong, Prof. Joo-Hyun Nam, Prof. Pong Mo Yuen> in the Asia-Pacific region who recognize the needs to share research achievements and further professional trainings

gynecological endoscopy.

APAGE represents over 15 associations in the gynecologic field worldwide, and provides various scientific and educational activities for doctors.

Since 2004, the APAGE Annual Congress has been the largest gynecologic meeting in the Asia-Pacific region. It holds congresses in conjunction with its affiliated societies, which are becoming increasingly popular within this region. Furthermore, it has launched its laparoscopic gynecologic oncology surgery and hands-on animal workshop since 2006 to provide all experts in the region with practical trainings and a platform to exchange their experiences. APAGE endeavors to promote educational exchanges between hospitals and countries; more than 200 doctors have completed APAGE's training program.

In 2007, the idea of regional meeting was brought out for connecting the diverse professional interests and needs of different countries in the Asia-Pacific Region. Moreover, the association has started its single-incision laparoscopy surgery workshop and robotics master course in gynecology in 2011. Finally, starting from 2014, APAGE has associated with AITS-IRCAD Taiwan on organizing reproductive surgery workshops focusing on hysteroscopy training.

As for the continuously research and practice, laparoscopic gynecologic surgery has gained popularity due to developments in illumination and instrumentation that led to the emergence of laparoscopy as a credible diagnostic as well as therapeutic intervention. APAGE is honored to share some of the responsibilities to make contributions to both the medical field and the public. The progress is non-stopped; we welcome everyone to join us and assist to lead an impetus to the field of minimally invasive gynecologic surgery.







hands-on surgery. It was attended by endoscopist from neighboring countries. And being a part of this wonderful event was a great honor for me.



Currently laparoscopy is gaining significant popularity over conventional laparotomy and indicated for benign uterine lesions including uterine myoma, adenomyosis and severe abnormal uterine bleeding with failed medical treatment. Laparoscopic hysterectomy offers several advantages compared to laparotomy hysterectomy. Innovative and practical approach like Natural Orifice Transluminal Endoscopy Surgery (NOTES) has been developed and adapted to manage gynecologic lesions. Transvaginal NOTES combines the features of vaginal surgery and the new techniques of Laparoendoscopic single site (LESS) surgery.

I learned many new knowledge and innovative techniques from the lectures, live demo and hands-on surgery. It was a privilege to be able to see, discuss and learn directly from the Faculties from different regions who invented and have been doing such novel surgeries since years ago, as Natural Orifice Transluminal Endoscopy Surgery is quite new technique in endoscopy field.

My Experience of Participation in the 2018 APAGE 1st NOTES Workshop



I attended the NOTES workshop as a lecturer, eventually, my knowledge nourished and my experience improved. In this article, I will describe this unique event briefly.

The workshop was hand on. So, there were 9 different patients with different indications for hysterectomy prepared and consented for the event. This was enough for the 8 hands on candidates registered in this event. The event took

place in one of the best hospital in Thailand, over three days. This constitution has conference room connected to the operation room. I have to say that this room is neat and support with all facilities such as, microphone, data show, comfortable chairs and excellent connection to the operation room. Moreover, there was two prepared operation room. Provided with the needed equipment and experienced staff. The event to place over three days as the following.



The first day morning there were lectures to introduce NOTES surgery to the candidates. The lectures prepared and given by experienced tutor. These lectures include patient preparation, anatomical land marks you face during surgery, and an important trick need to master this kind of operation. After an extraordinary lunch break, there was live demonstration by the creator of this technique professor Lee cl.

On the next day, we met again in the conference room. There was a simple discussion on how we will enter the theatre and candidate distribution. In addition, the tutors answer some enquires the candidates asked. Then we moved to the operation theatre.

There were two theaters four candidates in each room. So, two operations running at the same time. In each room one candidate perform the operation with an expert tutor and the other three candidates observe. The candidates can see the operation clearly and discuss the steps with the tutors directly.



The day was separated into two sections, morning and afternoon.

After the morning section, we had our lunch and went back to theatre.

Again, two operations took place and another two candidates had the opportunity to perform. Briefly in the second day, 4 operations performed by 4 candidates under the control of expert tutor, and 4 candidates observe the operation twice.

On the last day, we follow the previous day plan. So, there was a brief discussion about the operation done on the second day, in the conference room and we went directly to the operation room. Obviously, the remaining candidates had the opportunity to perform. All in all, the candidates observed the operation five times and did once.

It is important to mention that there was Varity of cases prepared for this event and each had its own difficulty. So, there were patients with previous caesarean section, large uterus (fibroid, adenomyosis), and patient with narrow vagina.



I have to say that Bangkok is a place worth visiting, when you visit it you will realize why it is one of the most important tourists' destinations. They have extraordinary food, amazing historical place and very kind, generous and helpfully people.

In brief, I believe that this workshop is


unique, in terms of design, opportunity for the participant to perform on real patient, and the amount of exposure they had.

On the first day, there were the demonstrations on both diagnostic and operative hysteroscopy techniques and I had a very impressive experience for hands-on hysteroscopy techniques from a famous hysteroscopist from Italy that is Prof. Attilio Di Spiezio Sardo. On the second day, I had received a valuable knowledge regarding the most clinically relevant tips and tricks in many lecture sessions from the great endoscopists and gynecologic surgeons. More over the innovative technology of fluorescence imaging with indocyanine green was introduced and applied in the animal lab. On that day, I had the first experience for laparoscopic lymphadenectomy by myself in animal lab and it make me felt more confident to do laparoscopic lymphadenectomy in the future.



The last I would like to many thanks Prof.Lee, Associate Prof.Huang and APAGE society who gave me the opportunity to participate in 2017 APAGE Oncology Hands-on Workshop—Advancements in Fluorescence Imaging, 3D and Hysteroscopy in IRCAD Taiwan. This is a valuable experience workshop.

Reflections of APAGE Fellowship

It has been a month since I returned home to Mumbai after completing the APAGE fellowship in Chang Gung Memorial Hospital, that I sit down to write this article. I spent two years in that wonderful place and I must admit that parting ways was a bittersweet experience. The sweet sense of accomplishment at finishing the course, setting foot into the world of gynaecological endoscopy with a sense of purpose and accomplishment which only experience provides. I still remember the last night before I was due to fly home the next day, after all the goodbyes were said, that a sense of sadness set in; that I was leaving a place I had grown to love and call home for the past two years, leaving behind friends and mentors was like leaving family behind. I felt a strange sense of loss even though I was returning to my home, to my family, to real life. I first arrived in Taiwan in April of 2015 prepared to spend the next two years entrenched in academia. The fellows who were already there were very welcoming and made acclimatising to Taiwanese life very easy. The APAGE fellowship for minimally invasive gynaecology is one of the most comprehensive programs in the world, at one of the largest hospitals in the world, run by some of the pioneers in the field of gynaecological endoscopy. In the first few weeks, one of the first things I noticed was the dedication to perfection and true passion for teaching among the mentors. Their obvious skill was shrouded in modest humility which is a trait rarely seen nowadays.

The programme is very well designed and involves a period of observation for the first month. After that the fellows undergo rotations under different mentors thereby exposing them to a wide variety of techniques and skills as well as a vast multitude of surgeries. There is no shortage of surgeries as Chang Gung Memorial Hospital is the largest tertiary referral hospital in Taiwan and the majority of cases we grew accustomed to were advanced gynaecological endoscopy as well as gynaecologic oncology. Prof Lee and his team pioneered the technique of NOTES surgery for gynaecology and learning this technique will prove to be a useful tool in the armamentarium of APAGE fellows.

Apart from the OR learning, there were weekly meetings organized by the mentors where the fellows discussed surgical techniques while watching recorded cases of the previous weeks surgeries. Another incredible learning tool was video editing, which entailed poring over hours of surgical footage to skim it down to 5 minutes of the salient features of the case; which taught the steps of the surgery as well as the finer nuances through repetitive learning.

Although two years may seem like a long time, they flew by like a breeze. The state of constant learning and being surrounded by world class surgeons does stimulate the mind like nothing else. It may seem daunting to some, but I believe it brings out the best in people. Prof Lee and

Prof Huang and their team have an untiring drive toward excellence and to pass on the knowledge of their techniques.

The second year was where I developed a didactic teaching program for the fellows where a particular topic was assigned every month and presentations were made which stimulated feverent discussions and enhanced learning. Over the course of those two years I met many people from all over the world. Lifelong friendships were formed with many of the international fellows as well as the Taiwanese doctors. I travelled to many countries taking part in APAGE courses, from Singapore to China to Thailand as well as Malaysia. I will always consider my tenure in Taiwan as special and owe my surgical competence and confidence to my time spent there and my teachers. To the incoming fellows and the current fellows I urge you all to make the most of your time in Taiwan reassure you that you could not be in better hands. Till we meet again!

I have experience in the APAGE fellowship from January 2017 to December 2017 at Linkou Chang Gung Memorial Hospital, Taoyuan, Taiwan. My mentors are Prof. Chyi-Long Lee, Assoc. Prof. KG Huang, Assist Prof. Kai-Yun Wu, Dr. Chen-Ying Huang and Dr. HH Kou. There was a lot of experience there. I learned how to do minimally invasive procedures as a simple and effective way and learn how to do advance surgery safely. New techniques were invented here such as NOTES hysterectomy. I felt impressed in this kind of procedure because it is a scarless technique and this is a new thing of mine.

There are many kinds of operations every week that makes me feel excited to learn. Every Tuesday we had a meeting in the morning with Assoc. Prof. KG Huang and every Tuesday afternoon we also had the VDO meeting and topic presentation with Prof. Chyi-Long Lee to discuss the pitfalls of the last week operation by reviewing the VDO of surgery and discussing how to do it correctly and safely on next time. This meeting stimulated brainstorming among the fellows to generate the best way to practice and learn together as Picture1 and Picture 2.



In the operating theater, we had experience as an assistant and a surgeon to do the surgery



under supervision as Picture 3. This is a valuable opportunity for international minimally invasive fellows to get from our mentors and gain our experience. However, before getting in the operation, we have to keep practicing with training box for the ability and dexterity of suturing and tying skills as Picture 4.

In my opinion, this is an invaluable experience to training here, and I get a lot of techniques and knowledge



regarding minimally invasive procedures.

APAGE Fellowship – My Experience

I have chosen the APAGE short-term fellowship as an optional internship of my fifth year of residency in gynecology and obstetrics in Portugal. A lot of people asked me why APAGE and Taiwan and my answer was very easy: I had very good references from a Portuguese doctor who had done the same few years before, and also because I like to know different cultures, ways of living and working, and Taiwan seemed to be a great option. And I was absolutely right,

it was an excellent choice! I met prestigious professors, who are world references, great physicians magnificently performing endoscopic surgery, and a spectacular group of long-term and short-term international fellows, from Thailand, India, Jordan, Myanmar and Philippines. However, the impact was not negligible. From the language, food and culture in general, to the ways of working and performing laparoscopy, each day I learned a variety of new things. The experience could not be more enriching.

I come from Hospital Pedro Hispano, in Matosinhos, near to Porto in the north of the country, and as a resident I had already some experience in laparoscopic surgery, mostly simple and benign cases, and a special interest in this area – the reason I apply for the fellowship. During these two months, every day there were many different endoscopic surgeries going on in different operating rooms. I usually started by learning more about each patient's clinical history. Afterwards watched all the procedure and often at the end we had a brief discussion about the case with the performing surgeon. I have seen numerous endoscopic procedures, including some I have not seen before, namely vaginal Natural Orifice Transluminal Endoscopic Surgery (NOTES), gynecological robotic surgeries, including single port robotic procedures, robotic staging surgeries for endometrial cancer with lymph node dissections; I learned new techniques, such as Lee-Huang point, laparoscopic/robotic ovary transposition and cervical cerclage techniques, between many others. Thus, I could watch plenty of benign cases, including urogynecology and infertility cases and also oncological cases, almost 100% of them performed by laparoscopy. All surgeons performed it amazingly well and fast, making it look easy! Chang Gung Memorial Hospital also has high quality facilities and cutting-edge technology.

Every Tuesday we also had scientific meetings, led by Professor Huang and Professor Lee, morning and afternoon, respectively. Here we discussed videos of surgeries from the previous week, presented different topics in the area of endoscopic surgery, case reports, scientific reviews and other works for publication. I also had the opportunity to do some presentations and scientific work, which we submitted for publication. It was an honor to be able to work and learn from such excellent professionals/teachers.

In addition to scientific and clinical achievements, cultural exchange was also incredibly teaching, as we could discuss many clinical and non-clinical issues about each of our countries and realities. Everybody welcomed me very well: the international group of fellows, the team of Taiwanese doctors and Taiwanese people in general. I found Taiwan and Taiwanese lovely and friendly. This internship has definitely made me scientifically and socially richer, with the bonus of a few more long-distance friends and working partners!


